Along the Way . . .

Christmas has ended. The ornaments are in their nests for another 11-month hibernation. Many of Joan's world-array of Nativity sets have been returned to their perch overlooking the den and others to their closet grotto awaiting another post-Thanksgiving pilgrimage to prominence around

our house. The electric candles have been extinguished from our front windows, the garland unwoven from the porch bannister, and the out-of-doors window-wreaths laid to rest. Feasting has given way to fantasies of fitness - from kingly portions to monkish collation. The only reminder of Christmas-past is the errant glitter from well-wishers' cards or children's presents which will be impervious to eradication until a new batch is introduced next Christmas.

It is both customary and conducive to reflect on the year that was and project expectations for the year to be in a January newsletter. "New" seems like an appropriate designation for many of last year's events. Four of our missionary couples gained a new family member with the arrival of babies: Anna Jensen in April; Thomas Cole in May; Henry Martyn Farmer in November; and Hope Hancock in December. This is the first announcement of the Hancocks' new

arrival in this paper, so some stats are in order. Hope Eliora was born on 12-13-14 at 3:03 AM in Bangkok, Thailand. She was 7lbs. 12oz. and 21 inches long (tall).

Hope Hancock not only met her parents and two brothers her first day, but also her Grandmother Christenson, who had flown from Pennsylvania to Southeast Asia to help her daughter Becky during this time. She was also a help with getting Hope's passport in near record time. The Hancocks' drive from Phnom Penh, Cambodia,

to Bangkok was true "travelling mercies." Neither Matt nor Becky speak Khmer good enough for what transpired at the border when they had to change drivers and vehicles. But the Lord worked things

out even better than they could have imagined. The Hancocks (minus Matt, who drove) and Ruth Christenson flew back to Phnom Penh on December 19 in time to have Christmas at their house in the capital of Cambodia.

Another "new" for two of these families was their new homes. The Hancocks moved to Cambodia in April, and the Jensens followed at the beginning of July. The **Hancocks** departed the same week as their commissioning service at Trinity Bible Church of Greer, SC, and the **Jensens** flew out the same week that Josh was ordained at Hampton Park Baptist Church of Greenville, SC. Both families found comfortable lodging just a five-minute drive from each other, and all four adults are up-to-their-eyeballs in Khmer language training. We are so thankful for how these two households have adapted to life in Cambodia.

During my February/March visit to Uruguay, two "news" happened. The first was having EMU board member Nelson Neal accompany me to Uruguay for the family camp and workers' conference. (A minor first happened to me between those two weeks when I literally walked out of my shoe on a hike up and down Sugar Loaf Mountain!) At the very end of our stay in Uruguay, FEBU opened its doors as the first Bible "college" in Uruguay. This project of many Bible-believing churches and mission organizations in Uruguay has been a dream of many Christians for a long time. This first year of classes seems to have been a success, but important decisions need to be made to improve FEBU. From EMU, Matias Espinel and John Mark and Deborah Steel are teaching in the college.

During the EMU Board meeting at the end of August, we added several new board members, with another added a few weeks later. At the August meeting we also lost three of our long-serving members due to ill health and age. A new feature was also added to the Board of Directors to involve the members more in the "running" of EMU. Four committees were created: Home Office Finance, Uruguay Ministry, Prospective Missionaries, and Missionary Care. We appreciate these men's willingness to serve on various committees to improve our operations and contact with the missionaries.

An unusual situation for our Board meeting was that for the first time in several years none of our on-furlough missionaries in 2014 were in town to join us at the Board luncheon. The Espinels and Tim Chapmans were stateside to visit supporting churches and friends, but not in our area. The Crowleys and Nuñezes were in the States at other times for brief periods for meetings. They will both be taking longer furloughs in 2015 and 2016, respectively.

A number of our other missionaries are slated for **furlough** in 2015, too. The **Coles** return from France on January 20. They will be traveling out of the missionary parsonage of their sending church,

Cleveland Park Bible Church of Spartanburg, SC. The Crowlevs return from Cambodia at the beginning of February. The Kanes follow in March and the Farmers in May. All of these families will be taking 4-6-month furloughs. Pray that they will be able to visit as many of their supporters as possible in the interim. Going in the "other direction," Joan and I will be leaving the USA for 3 weeks in February and March to be with the speaker (and his wife) for the family camp and workers' conference in Uruguay - Brad and Peg Lapiska. Then later in 2015, Joan and I hope to visit the Tim Chapmans in Lima, Perú - the one ministry of ĒMU we have yet to see firsthand. This second trip is being paid for with travel miles from American Airlines, for which we are thankful.

We also appreciate the Americans and others who traveled to Uruguay in 2014 to preach and teach in churches, camps, and FEBU: Pastor Segundo Rodriguez from Perú; Rev. Bill Hill from Greensboro, NC; and Dr. Gary Reimers from Greenville, SC. And, as has been his custom for many years, in October Rick Jensen took a team of workers to Camp Emmanuel in Uruguay for just under two weeks: Britt & Titus Hopper and Pat DalPorto. Steve Erkens joined the team mid-way through their visit and then remained for another week.

Over the past year, Steve and I have made good progress towards Steve becoming the next director of EMU. And Joan and Kami in the office have been excellent teachers for Steve as he learns the office procedures.

Looking ahead to the coming months, it is difficult for me to predict what will happen. Often, even the things I think are a "sure thing" evaporate in a flash of the unexpected. Without a knowledge that God loves us and is in control, these turn of events would be far more discouraging. Also, a lifetime of seeing Him bring greater blessing out of

seeming tragedy is a comfort. So I will refrain from prognostications. I can pretty much promise that there will be changes – expected and otherwise.

However, some things do seem fairly certain, such as the travels mentioned above. Along with those I will add the camps to be held in Uruguay in January at Camp Emmanuel: Staff Training is the 7th-10th; Children's Camp is the 12th-17th; Jovenes Camp is the 19th-24th; and the Adolescent Camp is the 26th-31st. Our pool of volunteer staff has dwindled in recent years so that more work is placed on fewer people. Pray for these who have a vision for the camp ministry in Uruguay. Also pray that sufficient sponsorship donations will be given (even in the few days before camp) to help with the cost of each week of camp. One of our greatest needs at Camp Emmanuel is ongoing support of the camp from outside sources committed to camp ministry. (Every Christian camp facility and program I know of in the U.S. and overseas requires donations far beyond the income from camper fees to continue operating weeks of camp at costs that campers can afford.) Pray with us that these needs will be met.

Another "sure thing" for 2015 is that the

Lord will supply what we need, as He did in 2014. This assurance does not preclude our need to set **budgets** in the Home Office and for the ministries in Uruguay. Though the latter budget will not be set by the Uruguay Board of Directors until March (the fiscal year is April to March), there are already some difficult decisions we are having to make based on projections. Pray that the Lord will give us wisdom as we consider issues that affect missionaries' lives.

We are hoping that this pictorial newsletter will be useful to you: a prayer reminder, putting faces with names, names with places, and names and numbers with families (the information sheet). We begin another year by thanking the Lord for friends like you who are taking an interest in at least some aspect of a ministry or missionary family with EMU International. And we trust that He will prosper you in all ways, but especially spiritually. Every year past is another year closer to seeing Jesus Christ face-to-face. May we never forget that! **P**
