Along the Way . . .



Sadly, in my teen years, a time when many teens become rebellious, I strayed from God's path. It was during the years 2000-2001 when I clearly left my Christian family and God. During that time, I married Patricia, who is still my wife today. We had three children during those early years: Daniel, Gabriel, and Emanuel. I continued walking in the world, but God's plans are wonderful.

In 2012, the company I worked for sent me to Maldonado to work. While I was there, without my family, I felt the compelling need to search for God. It was then that I started attending the church where brother Roberto Alvez was pastoring. After a few months, the company sent me back to Rivera, and I continued attending church where I had grown up. Then, after reading the Bible in my house one day, I prayed. Under God's leading, I found myself begging for forgiveness for my sins and acknowledging my faults as I accepted Christ into my heart as my only and sufficient Savior. A passage from the Bible started to resonate in my mind and heart -Proverbs 22:6, "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will

Sometime after that, an opportunity came for me to work during the annual work week at Camp Emmanuel in Guazuvirá. It was there one day, after the various jobs were finished, that God spoke to me and I knew that I wanted to serve Him with what I could do. I do not know how to preach, and I am not gifted with words, but God prepared me with skills and wisdom in many areas of "handy work."

As soon as I arrived back in Rivera, I went to talk to my pastor, Héctor Gómez, so we could pray about my calling, which by then was very clear to me. I had no idea that there would ever be an opportunity in Uruguay for me to serve doing the type of work that I know. After that meeting, only Héctor and I knew about my calling, and it was a very important matter of prayer

for me. After a few years, Pedro Donzé, the camp director, started telling me about Luis Rios' planned retirement and the need at camp for someone to take his place. With much joy I continued to pray even more, and I continued to ask God for His leading in this matter. Then in 2019 I told my wife about my desire and proposed the possibility of our family filling that need at Camp Emmanuel. With great joy she immediately agreed and supported me. Her response confirmed the calling and prayers which until then I had only shared with Héctor. Now many more became involved in praying with us.

By God's grace, my family is now living at Camp Emmanuel (as of October 2020). We

thank God for the answers to prayer and for the encouragement of seeing the wonders He has worked on our behalf. It was through many adversities that we made it here, especially during our last month in Rivera. But we continue to have the confidence and joy of knowing we are doing what pleases God and that we are obeying His plans for us.

I could tell you many other things that happened along the way, but I don't want to make this testimony too long. I just want to say to you, my brothers and sisters in Christ, that it is a privilege to be able to serve God full-time. I thank Him for bringing me here. And I thank Him that it did not happen in the middle of hard circumstances when I did not have a job or when I had other needs. It happened by His will and the work that He did in me, and that He will continue to work in me and in my family.

This whole process flowed in a natural manner. For many years I lived convinced but not converted. Today I enjoy my conversion and the work that He does in me, in spite of my mistakes (Romans 7:7). This passage reminds me that I am not the only one struggling with sin, but I am upheld and encouraged by His Word. It gives us clear and precise answers, encourages us, lifts us up, and instructs us. I tell others that our life manual is the Bible. Without the inspired Word, we would not know how to walk in this world. God's mercies are infinite, and I have been able to experience them through the years and now as I have worked these few months at Camp Emmanuel. God has shown us His love, power, and sovereignty every day. †

on many October work teams at Camp Emmanuel and holds Henry in high esteem for his knowledge and work ethic. This is a very difficult time for Camp Emmanuel as the summer camps had to be cancelled for 2021 - EMU camps and rental camps. So, funds for repairs and maintenance have been scarce. But, thank the Lord, His people have given to keep work at the camp going forward. Jeff Davis has asked the camp director, Pedro Donze, to move the three days of Workers' Conference to April rather than February hoping that the annual mission gathering can be held at Camp Emmanuel.

Since Christmas, the COVID pandemic has gone from mainly affecting EMU ministries to infecting more of our missionaries. You already know about the Kane family having COVID last summer, but since Christmas Marco and Gwendolyn Nuñez, Toño Alvarado's family, and Daniel

Hernandez's family had coronavirus in Cancun, Mexico; Michael Cole contracted the virus after coming Stateside from France; and Matt Hancock in Cambodia believes he had it. All these folks are doing fine now. However, one of our EMU Board members, Dan Sallé, has been very ill with COVID for weeks in ICU. He seems to be showing some slight glimmers of hope. And several friends of our family and of EMU have been or are gravely ill from the ravages of this virus. Thank you for your prayers.

Amazingly, during this time of chaos, Alexis Shoemaker was able to move to Lima, Peru, to begin her year of ministry in the church that Tim and Cheryl Chapman started in that enormous capital city. Though only there less than a month, she is immersed in the language and culture. She does need to find a more permanent apartment to rent by March. The Peruvian government's COVID restrictions have become much tighter, and the Chapmans' church has gone back to on-line services.

The **Crnkovic's** second daughter had to postpone her wedding indefinitely this winter in Croatia because of stricter regulations, and all schools are now virtual. However, the virus was not able to delay the addition of another grandchild to **Jeff and Joanna Davis'** collection in January.

Several of our missionaries who are Stateside - the **Kanes**, **Coles**, **Espinels**, **Steels**, and **Davises** - will be having services in February. Pray for successful meetings.

And thanks to each of you who uphold the work of EMU in prayer before the Lord, from Whom all blessings flow. May the God Who continues to supply our every need continue to supply yours as well. The Lord bless you! †


