The Promise-of-Purchase Agreement

Family news

We are grateful that our oldest son, Micaiah, has successfully graduated from French high school and has begun his next round of studies! He is presently enrolled in a two-year industrial maintenance engineering program at the University of Paris 8. He makes about a 1.5-hour commute by bus from home, each way. It is his desire to work through the process of obtaining his French nationality during this two-year period and then move to the States for further studies. Please pray for him as well as his younger siblings. Miriam has now begun 11th grade. After a year of homeschooling, Zacharie has started 7th grade in the same school as his sister. Gabriel is in 4th grade at our neighborhood school just one block away. As Simeon is only two years old, we have one more year before we will be legally bound to make some schooling choice for him.

Church building news

After several delays and too many twists and turns to relate here, we were able to sign the promise-of-purchase agreement on July 21! This was a very exciting step for us because it finalizes all the negotiations. We are hoping that the closing will take place at the end of November, just before our rental contract ends on December 1. The Lord's timing is perfect! It is amazing that we have enough money in our bank account to make the purchase! At the beginning of this year, we had less than 1/3 of the money needed! We are so grateful to God and to all those who have donated generously to this project. About 1/4 of the money was given in the form of short-term loans. Although that financial pressure remains, the gracious provision of God to this point gives us confidence as we look to the future.

Trip to Pessac

Our good friends and former coworkers, Michael and Liz Cole, are in the process of moving back to the USA. Though we are sad to see them leave France, we know that this is God's best for them. In July, we were able to spend about two weeks down near Bordeaux (7 hours south of us) to help fill in at the Baptist church in Pessac where they have served for the last three years. I was there when my parents founded the church 30 years ago, and then our family spent our first four years working alongside my parents in

the church when we moved to France 12 years ago. It was a joy to reconnect with friends we hadn't seen in several years and revive old memories. I taught a weekend workshop/ seminar with a few of the men to help them better prepare Bible studies and sermons. I also enjoyed the privilege of preaching for them on two consecutive Sundays. Our final evening was spent with a nominally Muslim family that we have known since our first year in France. Ruth was also able to meet with another Muslim lady with whom she forged a friendship more than 10 years ago. Please pray that these relationships will not be in vain for the good of their souls.

Visits from the States

This summer we were blessed to have the visits of both of our mothers, one right after the other. We enjoyed some special moments making memories. For Ruth's mom, it marked a milestone, being her first time to travel here without Ruth's dad who went to heaven last fall. And it was good for my mom to be able to be in France again as she had been wanting to return for a long time, having had to postpone her trip twice due to the pandemic.

Government oversight of religious activity

As you know, the clash of irreconcilable ideologies within the same nation-states is leading this world's governments toward unprecedented and more repressive legislation. France has finally passed a new law (which we have written about in our previous updates) providing more government oversight of religious organizations. This law relates specifically to the finances of religious organizations, but also to the content of their teachings. Just this year the Minister of the Interior (who oversees regulations regarding religious groups) asked two different mosques to break all ties with their imams because of statements they had made revealing their misogyny. Their theological and methodological errors acknowledged, it seems that what provoked the government's heavy-handed intervention was the very fact that one of them exhorted women to modesty and the other to submission. As a legal specialist representing the Roman catholic bishops of France stated in an article about this situation, intervention like this puts the simple reading of certain biblical texts in danger of being censured. It is this same law that will put new restrictions on homeschooling, not making it outright illegal, but requiring prior authorization (rather

than a simple declaration, as before) that will only be given if specific needs are demonstrated in the child. The details are yet forthcoming. †

The Coles' financial supporters have already been apprised of their plans. Michael will continue to help the French congregation at least through the end of this year. An article by Michael and Liz, we trust, will be forthcoming in the latter part of this year.

As of today, Michael does not have another job lined up in the States. The Coles are currently living in Charlotte, NC, close to Michael's parents, and attending a supporting church. Their four children are enrolled at the Christian school where Michael's parents taught for many years.

Please pray for direction, comfort, and strength for the Coles during these difficult days. And pray for the church in Pessac as they transition to national leadership.

The **Tim Chapman family** - minus Lauren, who is attending BJU - are back in Lima, Peru, as of September 9. Tim's email to the office was very encouraging as the church in Lima actually continued to grow during their absence. They are currently running about 150. COVID restrictions still hamper the congregation, but the Lord is blessing.

Tom and Connie Chapman left the USA in September, too, but their destination was Monterrey, Mexico, where three of their children and their families live and minister at a Bible college. They hope to be able to return to Antofagasta, Chile, at the end of October or beginning of November. Much will depend on Chile's restrictions for those arriving. When Tom and Connie were with us in September, Tom let us know that a local Greenville, SC, doctor may have properly diagnosed one of Tom's long-term physical problems. We are all encouraged as the fix was not too difficult.

Work on the Rick Projects at Camp Emmanuel in Uruguay continue, and donations continue to come into the mission office to help with the costs. Last month's Newsletter showed five of the original projects fully funded. This month, we can add to that list the gutters for the Chapel, the fencing for the camp entrance, and part of the cost for security cameras. Pedro Donzé, the camp director, has been sending us weekly pictures of the work accomplished, and it is truly amazing! I hope to share some of those photos with you in the next Newsletter.

Every Local Church a College Classroom

Wednesday, August 25, at 5:00 PM India Standard Time (7:30 AM EST), the cameras were rolling and students from all over India logged into the first Good News 360 Virtual Church Leaders Conference. Over the next four days, a crew of over twentyfive willing servants worked together to host 1,136 registered participants in our first attempt at a virtual conference. Fourand-a-half years earlier, we had sponsored the first Good News 360 Conference with about 550 participants. The global pandemic presented an incredible challenge for us as we had to postpone this year's conference several times. We eventually decided to host the conference virtually. As you can imagine, the logistics of pulling off a production like this even without the COVID restrictions were daunting, but God surrounded us with skilled volunteers, and He provided us a location, the proper equipment, technological experts, and the necessary funds. We are grateful for the servant leadership of our Board of Directors in India and all their hard work in helping to organize this event. Our goal

was to provide a 360-degree circle of fellowship to equip and connect Bible students, pastors, and church leaders in a transformative program for planting and developing local churches.

As each participant logged into the meeting via Zoom, YouTube, WhatsApp, or Facebook, they had the choice of hearing the broadcast in English, Hindi, or Telugu. God blessed us with some

amazing translators. Dr. G. Java Sekhar, Billy's father, opened the first meeting and established the theme for the entire conference, "Every Local Church a College Classroom." The need for theological education in India is great. Ninety percent of rural pastors have little or no theological training. Good News Bible College and Seminary was founded in 1999. Currently, they have 57 teaching sites in nine states of India with 16,806 graduates. The program is one to five years, two hours each evening Monday through Saturday, 240 hours in a year. They have thirty textbooks that they use. It is also financially sustained through each local church.

India, with 1.38 billion people, is second in world population behind China which has 1.44 billion. India is projected to have the largest population in the world within the next fifteen years. According to Operation World, India, by far, is the most unreached country in the world. One-third of the world's unreached people groups are from one country - India. Four hundred million people in India have never heard the name, Jesus. Constitutionally, there are 22 official languages in India, but there are over 1,600 other languages with no Scriptures.

In addition to the national Indian workers, we enlisted nine speakers from the United States who promoted the theme of "Every Local Church a College Classroom," through four different focuses: Discipleship, Stewardship, Shepherding, and Church.

Billy is tentatively planning a trip to the USA in 2022 to promote the opportunity we have of participating in this amazing ministry that God is blessing in India.
